
The condition of subdivision streets



In 2021, more than half the subdivision mileage in Genesee County was rated as being in poor condition.

What can residents **do**?

Form a Special Assessment District through your township

It is a citizen-initiated public petition and assessment process by the local township government.

It requires at least 51% of property owners' signatures.

It is a multi-step process. There are multiple opportunities for input or to stop the process.

GCRC will pay engineering and inspection (up to 25% of the total project cost).

The township would issue bonds at a rate they would receive from the market based on the township's current bond rating.



What is the County **Road System?**

The County Road System includes all public roads that are not state trunk lines and that are outside of incorporated cities. As shown below, it is made up of 467 miles of County Primary and 1,130 miles of County Local roads.

Who is responsible for the maintenance of county roads?

Primary Roads -

GCRC is responsible for maintenance and reconstruction. GCRC receives federal and state funds.

Local Roads -

GCRC is responsible for maintenance. GCRC receives state funds. State law prohibits GCRC from paying more than half the cost of major reconstruction. GCRC allocates funds for capital improvements which are able to be matched by townships.

Subdivision Streets -

GCRC is responsible for maintenance. State law prohibits GCRC from paying more than half the cost of major reconstruction. By policy, GCRC participation in reconstruction is limited to engineering and inspection (up to 25% of project cost). These roads are not eligible for federal aid.





Where do county road funds come from?

The Genesee County Road Commission's primary source of funding comes from the Michigan Transportation Fund (MTF). Revenue collected through state fuel taxes and vehicle registration fees is deposited into this fund. There is a specific formula as to how this money is distributed and how it can be úsed.

4 in. Limestone Resurfacing (20' wide)\$95,000
3 in. Gravel Resurfacing (20' wide)\$60,000
2 in. Asphalt Resurfacing (30' B/C to B/C)\$350,000
2 in. Asphalt Resurfacing (26' wide open ditch streets)\$235,000
Microsurfacing (26' wide)\$100,000
Ditching, Grading and Paving (26' wide with 4 in. shoulder)\$1,100,000
Grading and Paving with Concrete Curb & Gutter (30' B/C to B/C)\$1,400,000
Base crush and shape with 5 in. resurfacing \$720,000
